EXTERNAL ASSESSMENTS OVERVIEW

All candidates take Paper 1 Poetry and Prose, and EITHER Paper 2 Drama, OR Paper 3 Drama (Open Text) and Paper 4 Unseen, OR Paper 3 Drama (Open Text) and Component 5 Coursework. Candidates will be eligible for grades A* to G.

Paper 1 - Poetry and Prose

This is a compulsory written paper. It is an externally set assessment, marked by Cambridge International. Candidates answer two questions: one from Section A (Poetry) and one from Section B (Prose). (25%)

Paper 2 - Drama

This is an optional written paper. It is an externally set assessment, marked by Cambridge International. Candidates answer two questions on two texts. (25%)

Paper 3 - Drama (Open Text)

This is an optional written paper. It is an externally set assessment, marked by Cambridge International. Candidates answer one question from a choice of two. (25%)

Paper 4 - Unseen

This is an optional written paper. It is an externally set assessment, marked by Cambridge International. Candidates answer one question from a choice of two. (25%)

Component 5 - Coursework

This is an optional component. It is internally assessed and externally moderated. Candidates submit a portfolio of two assignments (600–1200 words each). Each assignment should be based on the study of one complete text. The text must be equivalent in scope and demand to the set texts for Papers 1, 2 and 3. (25%)

WHY CHOOSE THIS SYLABUS?

Cambridge IGCSE Mandarin Chinese develops a set of transferable skills for understanding and communicating in everyday situations in Chinese. Learners begin to develop cultural awareness of countries and communities where Chinese is spoken. They acquire the essential linguistic skills required for progression to further studies or employment.

Q CONTENT OVERVIEW

The subject content is organised in five broad topic areas (1 - 5 below). These provide contexts for the acquisition of vocabulary and the study of grammar and structures. The study of these topic areas enables students to gain an insight into countries and communities where Chinese is spoken.

The five broad topic areas listed below:

- 1 Everyday activities
- 4 The world of work
- Personal and social life
- The international world
- 3 The world around us

The syllabus gives students opportunities to develop and apply a wide range of foreign language skills. Candidates will be expected to read and understand a variety of written and spoken texts on familiar topics. Candidates will be required to demonstrate understanding of the main ideas, opinions and attitudes, as well as select and extract relevant details and deduce the meaning of occasional unknown words from context. They will also have opportunities to write in Chinese on familiar, everyday topics, and to speak the language by taking part in everyday conversations.



EXTERNAL ASSESSMENTS OVERVIEW

All candidates take two components. Candidates will be eligible for grades A* to G.

Component 1 Listening: Candidates listen to a number of recordings and answer multiple-choice and matching questions. (25%)

Component 2 Reading: Candidates read a number of texts and answer multiple-choice and matching questions as well as questions requiring short answers. (25%)

Component 3 Speaking: Candidates complete one role play and conversations on two topics. (25%)

Component 4 - Writing: Candidates complete one form-filling task, one directed writing task and one task in the format of an email/letter or article/blog. (25%)

WHY CHOOSE THIS SYLABUS?

Cambridge IGCSE Bahasa Indonesia encourages learners to read a variety of texts and improve their use and style of language in a range of contexts. Learners develop the ability to understand and respond to what they read and to communicate effectively in writing. These skills equip them for progression to further study or employment.



Q CONTENT OVERVIEW

Cambridge IGCSE Bahasa Indonesia offers learners the opportunity to develop practical communication skills in reading, writing and speaking.

- READING understand and respond to written language.
- WRITING communicate clearly, accurately and appropriately in writing.
- SPEAKING AND RESPONDING produce and respond to spoken language.

Learners will have the opportunity to respond knowledgeably to a range of texts during the course and use these texts to inform and inspire their own writing. They will be able to communicate facts and express their viewpoints with a degree of accuracy and clarity, in spoken and written form. Students are encouraged to become appreciative and independent readers, writers and speakers of Bahasa Indonesia in a range of contexts.



EXTERNAL ASSESSMENTS OVERVIEW

All candidates take two components. Candidates will be eligible for grades A* to G.

Paper 1 Reading and Understanding:

Candidates read four texts and answer gap filling, note taking and short answer questions. (35%)

Paper 2 Reading and writing:

Section 1: Candidates read a text and write a summary of 130-180 words.

Section 2: Candidates answer one question from a choice of three (argumentative, descriptive or narrative) and write a response of 350-500 words. (45%)

Component 3 Speaking:

Candidates present a topic relating to Indonesian culture. The candidate and teacher/examiner have a conversation about the topic. Internally assessed and externally moderated (20%)

WHY CHOOSE THIS SYLABUS?

Cambridge IGCSE Global Perspectives provides opportunities for enquiry into, and reflection on, key global issues from different perspectives: personal, local/national and global.

Cambridge IGCSE Global Perspectives encourages awareness of global problems and offers a range of opportunities to explore solutions through cooperation and collaboration. The course is not about getting everybody to think identically; rather it is a matter of opening minds to the complexity of the world and of human thought, and encouraging empathy for the diversity of human experience and feeling.

Q CONTENT OVERVIEW

Cambridge IGCSE Global Perspectives emphasises the development and application of skills rather than the acquisition of knowledge. Candidates develop transferable skills that will be useful for further study and for young people as active citizens of the future.

Cambridge IGCSE Global Perspectives candidates will have opportunities to acquire and apply a range of skills to support them in these challenges, including:

- Researching, analysing and evaluating information
- Developing and justifying a line of reasoning
- Reflecting on processes and outcomes
- Communicating information and reasoning

All candidates take two components. Candidates will be eligible for grades A* to G.

Component 1 Written Examination:

Candidates answer four compulsory questions based on a range of sources. Sources will present a global issue from a range of perspectives, personal, local and/or national, global, and will be drawn from a list of eight topics. (35%)

Component 2 Individual Report:

Candidates research one topic area of personal, local and/or national and global significance and submit a report based on their research. (30%)

Component 3 Team Project:

Candidates devise and develop a collaborative project into an aspect of one topic. (35%)


The syllabus helps equip learners with lifelong skills including:

Cambridge IGCSE Business Studies is accepted by universities and employers as proof of an understanding of business concepts and techniques across a range of different types of businesses. Learners will be able to:

- understand different forms of business organisations, the environments in which businesses operate and business functions such as marketing, operations and finance.
- · appreciate the role of people in business success. They will also gain lifelong skills, including:
- · the ability to calculate and interpret business data
- communication skills needed to support arguments with reasons
- the ability to analyse business situations and reach decisions or judgements.

WHY CHOOSE THIS SYLABUS?

Cambridge IGCSE Music is accepted by universities and employers worldwide as providing proof of musical skills, knowledge and understanding. This syllabus offers students the opportunity to develop their own practical musical skills through performing and composing. They also develop their listening skills by studying music from the main historical periods and styles of Western music as well as from selected non-Western traditions. The emphasis of the syllabus is as much on developing lifelong musical skills as on acquiring knowledge.

Q CONTENT OVERVIEW

Learners study music of all styles; each style is placed in its historical and cultural context, and learners are encouraged to be perceptive, sensitive and critical when listening. Although the majority of the syllabus examines Western European music, the music of other cultures is always represented.

Component 1 - Listening: World Focus for examination in 2023 - Indian Music

Section A: Unprepared Western Repertoire. Extracts from two works which may be instrumental and/or vocal selected from the Baroque, Classical and Romantic periods and the Twentieth Century.

Section B: World Music. Extracts from three pieces of music. Two of the pieces will be selected from African and Arab, Latin American, Chinese, Japanese, Indian and Indonesian traditions.

Section D: Set Work for examination in 2023 - Haydn: Symphony No. 100, Hob. I/100 Military: Movements 3 and 4 OR Brahms: Academic Festival Overture.



EXTERNAL ASSESSMENTS OVERVIEW

All candidates take two components. Candidates will be eligible for grades A* to G.

Component 1 Listening: Written examination based on CD recordings supplied by Cambridge International. (40%)

Component 2 Performing: Two prepared performances, one individual and one ensemble. (30%)

Component 3 Composing: Two contrasting compositions. (30%)
